Tammany again controls New York City, George B. McClellan, Democrat, being elected over Seth Low by over sixty thousand plurality. There is no politics in this election, whatever, except that it will mean an intrenchment of Tammany, whose back has so often been broken. Low made himself unpopular because he insisted on a Puritanical town in some places and a wide open town in other places where he expected to receive political support. Notwithstanding what the Low press has to say about his fine administration, New York has had something like Portland has contended with since Williams was elected—a great blow about purity while at the same time mingling with the lieutenants of the purities.

The Labor ticket in San Francisco again flayed both the old parties in the election which was held Tuesday, Mayor Schmitz being returned by a large plurality. The Bay city will now have a Labor mayor and a board of supervisors with a majority of Democrats.

Fred Olsen was the lucky man to win the 5-gallon keg of Old Kentucky Home Whiskey at Bissler's prize offering yesterday. The hoghead on which the guessing was made contained 1552 gallons and Olsen guessed it to the ounce. Many had guessed as high as 700 gallons.

C. B. Buchanan, of Cornelius, has decided to go out of the dairy business entirely, owing to pressure of other business. He has for sale, at public auction, Saturday, November 7, a lot of extra fine dairy cows, six being now fresh, and two fresh soon, Jerseys and Graded Jerseys, and one Shorthorn. Chas. Pierce, formerly of Greenville, and whose father some years ago kept a store at that place, has been arrested at Portland, on a charge of criminal assault, the alleged victim being a twelve-year-old niece, Pearl Fox. The court fixed his bond at \$1500, and in default, Pierce was remanded to jail to await the action of the grand jury. Pierce has been employed as a lineman for the General Electric for some time. His father resides at Forest Grove. Pierce has always been a "nerf-do-well," and while being generous, and all that, never possessed much character.

The cannery proposition is progressing very well, but there is still a considerable amount of stock needed to give the industry the right start. Many who have already subscribed have signified their intention of doubling the original subscription, and if a number of citizens do this, the cannery is assured. It is proposed to call a meeting of the stockholders as soon as possible, arrange the shortage yet needed, order the lumber, and have it delivered as soon as it can be purchased. Hillsboro should have this cannery, by all means, and it develops on citizens of public spirit to see that we get it. Hundreds of dollars will be expended here each year for labor as

well as for fruit and vegetables, and it will be a big business thing for the community. The committee is getting along nicely with the stock subscription list, and in a few days more will be able to report that the cannery will be established, or go somewhere else. Public spirit and private enterprise secured the big condenser which is now nearly ready for operation—and we should have no trouble in getting this cannery.
