Each year it is coming to be more evident that the only way for Washington county to get good roads—roads that are serviceable in winter, in places where rock is not available, is to plank the highways. Four or five, or say six, portable sawmills would solve the problem. The work that is annually spent on the roads at present under the present system, would saw and lay many miles of good plank highway, and afford main thoroughfares that could be traveled at any time. After the main highways were planked the tributary roads could be supplied. All are satisfied of the plausibility of the plan, but the main objection seems to be the argument that it would be expensive, and the county would have to pay for stumpage. One thing is certain—we shall never have decent roads in this wet country unless we pay for them.

The county republican central committee met in Hillsboro today with an attendance of about 15. The date for the primaries was set for Thursday, March 31, and the county convention will be held on April 7, the next Thursday after the primaries. It was decided to hold but one county convention, and this body will elect delegates to the state convention; delegates to the congressional convention; and nominate a legislative and county ticket for the coming campaign. The convention will consist of 170 delegates.

Sheriff Sewell's office is the scene of business these days, as tax collection commenced Tuesday morning. Money is not coming in as rapidly as last year, but as the office has longer time to grant the three per cent. rebate, no doubt more will take advantage of this than last season. Mr. Sewell has a force of seven aiding him: Max Crandall, C. E. Beckwith, W. J. Wall, Robt. Wirtz, A. C. Shute, of the Bank, Fred Sewell and Mrs. Sewell. Payers do not have to await their receipts very long, and the books are being kept up with the collections. The first two days' collections amounted to \$12,808.93.

A mass meeting of the citizens of Hillsboro and vicinity will be held at the Christian church at 3 p. m., next Sunday, in the interest of the American Bible Society. The former call, published last week, and stating the meeting to be at the M. E. Church in the evening is hereby annulled, as the Methodist quarterly meeting held at that time, interferes. A national appeal, signed by President Roosevelt, Grover Cleveland, Hon. John Hay, and other prominent Americans, has been sent out asking for the observance of a "Universal Bible Sunday," so that the work of the Society may be presented in all its importance to the people of the nation, and give them a chance to release it from its pressing obligations. As patriots and Christians let us discharge our duty that the noble work may long continue. Addresses will be made by pastors and those familiar with the work of the society.—Rev. A. Robinson.

Within a few days Hillsboro's big evaporated cream factory will be running full blast, the big plant now being installed and almost ready to operate. Mr. Rogers, the manufacturer of the machinery, has it all in place, and he says that this is the biggest plant of the kind west of the Mississippi. Hillsboro will be greatly benefited by this acquisition to its commercial interests, and to the enterprising stockholders of the condenser is due the fact that it is here. The new machinery is being thoroughly secured before starting, and the company will be operating the new plant in a day or so. This condenser will mean a revolution in the farming business of the vicinity, and many who have hitherto raised grain are now turning to dairy stock. The firm pays its patrons every month and this is of no small benefit in itself.

A family reunion with very pleasant features took place Sunday Feb. 28, at the residence of Mrs. Phoebe Kindt at Kinton. The occasion was especially in behalf of J. O. Kindt and family who for the last three and one-half years resided near Kiona, eastern Washington, but has sold his wheat ranch up there preparatory to moving to the Alberta, Canada, wheat belt. Proclamation.

WHEREAS, The Secretary of the State of Oregon has notified me in writing that pursuant to the provisions of an act entitled "An act making effective the initiative and referendum provisions of Section 1 of Article IV of the constitution of the State of Oregon, and regulating elections thereunder, and providing penalties for violations of provisions of this act", approved February 24, 1903, the Direct Primary Nominating League of Oregon duly filed in his office on February 3, 1904, an initiative petition, containing 8,730 signatures properly attached thereto, and certain of the same, with law, demanding that a proposed law, the tenor and effect of which is hereinafter particularly set forth, for direct primary nominations shall be submitted to the legal electors of the State of Oregon for their approval or rejection, at the general election to be held on the 4th day of June, 1904, being the first Monday of June, 1904, and that the said Direct Primary Nominating League of Oregon, announcing that the said Direct Primary Nominating League of Oregon has filed said initiative petition with the requisite number of signatures thereto attached, demanding that there be submitted to the legal electors of the State of Oregon for their approval or rejection at the regular election to be held on the 4th day of June, 1904, a proposed law for direct primary nominations, having for its purpose and being, briefly, of the tenor and effect following, that is to say:

A Bill to propose by initiative petition a law declaring certain rights of political parties and voluntary political organizations and of the members and candidates thereof; declaring the purposes of this law and prescribing rules for the construction of its provisions; defining a political party subject to the provisions of this law; providing for holding primary nominating elections preceding any election in this state (except special elections to fill vacancies, presidential elections, municipal elections, in towns or cities having a population of less than two thousand inhabitants, and school elections) for the purpose of nominating all the candidates for all political parties subject to this law, and for the purpose of filing at the ensuing election, and for a Senator in Congress; fixing the times for holding and regulating the manner of conducting such primary nominating elections; prescribing the manner of choosing candidates for nomination by the several political parties subject to the provisions of this law, and for making nominations at said primary nominating elections of the candidates of said political parties for election to public office at the ensuing election and forbidding the nomination of candidates for public office by such political parties in any other manner; providing for printing and distributing ballots at such primary nominating election by public officers at public expense; prescribing the qualifications of petitioners, electors and candidates for nomination at such primary nominating elections; prescribing forms and procedure at such primary nominating elections and in going thereon and statements to be made by candidates for nomination thereof; prescribing the duties of public officers in relation to and at such primary nominating elections; providing for the printing and distribution of ballots at such primary nominating elections; providing for the prevention of frauds and the punishment of crimes and misdemeanors committed at such primary nominating elections or in the proceedings relating thereto; providing penalties and punishment for the violation of any of the provisions of this law; providing for contesting nominations made at such primary nominating elections; applying to said primary nominating elections so far as the same are not in conflict with the provisions of this law, and as the same may be modified by the provisions of the general laws of Oregon as the same are numbered in Bellinger & Cotton's Annotated Codes and Statutes of Oregon, to-wit:
