TELEGRAPHIC

Mercury climbed to 87 in Portland, Tuesday.

Davenport, the famous cartoonist, is in Portland.

Wm King, an elderly Portland capitalist, attempted suicide, the other day.

Richard P. Hobson, the Merriam hero, loses the congressional primaries in Mississippi.

President Roosevelt has signed the Lewis & Clark bill carrying the \$475,000 appropriation.

Senator Stewart, of Nevada, has withdrawn from Nevada politics, and a successor, has been endorsed.

The Russians report having defeated a small Japanese detachment, without any loss upon their part. All the Japanese were killed.

Geo. McKinney, of East Portland, recently horsewhipped a motorman who had been paying undue attentions to the wife of the former.

Binger Hermann was yesterday renominated to succeed himself as congressman for the First District, and J. N. Williamson to succeed himself in the Second District.

A Dayton man, dissatisfied with the Oregon climate, committed suicide, Monday. No one knows where he will find a warmer place than Oregon has been the last few days.

A skeleton supposed to be two or three hundred years old has been found near Tacoma, the tree under which the body had been buried having been uprooted, and being three feet in diameter.

Premier Maura, of Spain, was attacked by an anarchist, Tuesday, and wounded. The premier was not badly wounded and telephoned for the officers. The assailant suicided when taken by the officers.

Admiral Makaroff the Russian naval commander, while engaged in an encounter with the Japanese, was drowned, with 800 men. The battle ship on which he was in command struck a Russian mine and was blown up. A big sea fight was raging at the time, Makaroff ordering the Port Arthur squadron out to fight the Japanese fleet of 40 war vessels. The result is bound to be a severe loss to Russia's prestige on the sea.

New York has sent Roosevelt delegates to the National nominating convention. Platt and Odell head the list.

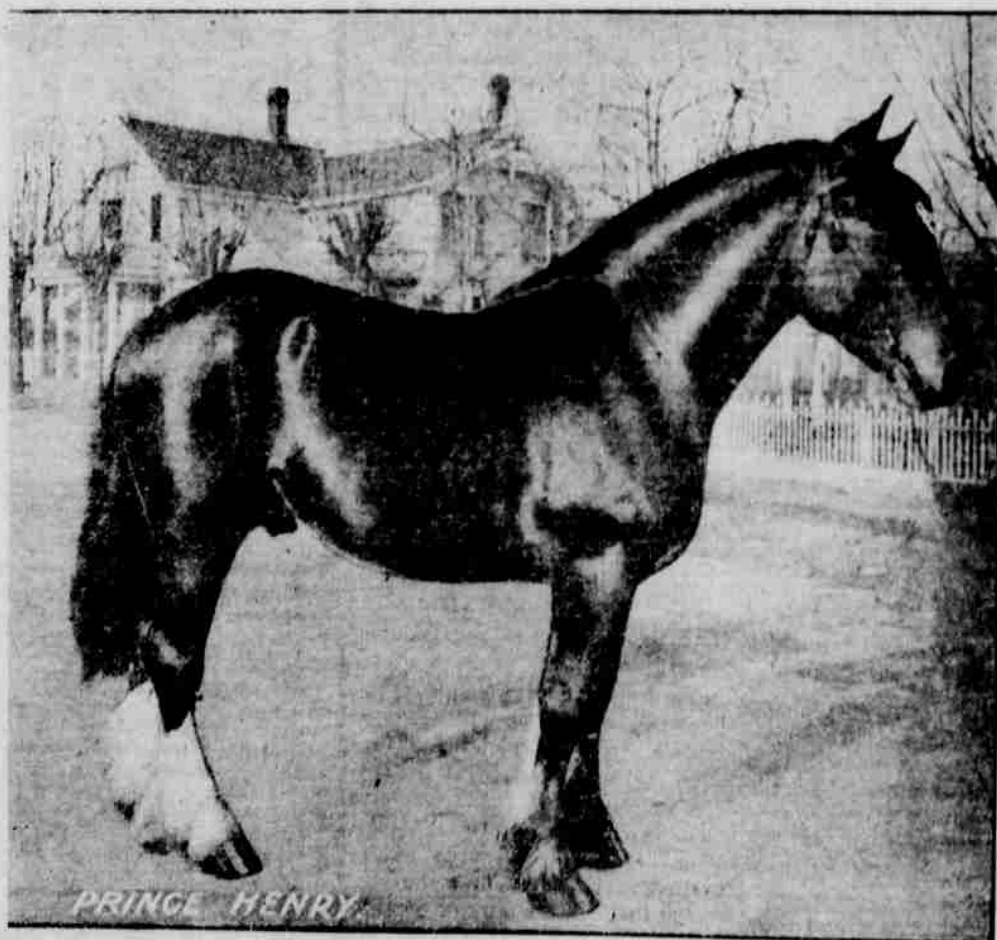
