NOTICE TO TAXPAYERS

The tax rolls for Washington County, Oregon, for the year 1904 will be open on Monday, February 27, 1905, and those paying their taxes by March 15, 1905, will receive a rebate of three per cent. Those paying one-half of their tax by April 3, 1905, may pay the remaining one-half by the first Monday in October, without extra charge, penalty, or interest. Those not paying one-half of their tax by April 3, 1905, will have added thereto a penalty of ten per centum, and an interest charge of one per centum per month, until paid, as the law provides and directs.
