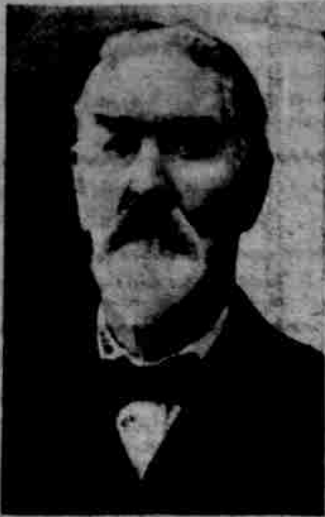


CELEBRATED GOLDEN WEDDING APRIL 11

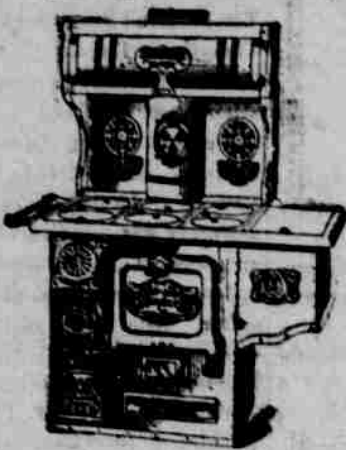

SUMMONS
