**Reduced Round Trip Excursion Rates to Pacific Coast in 1907**

During the Summer season of 1907, re- duced round trip excursion rates will be in effect from the East to the Pacific Coast, Montana, British Columbia and Arizona points.

Rates from Chicago via direct lines to North Pacific Coast points will be \$75, and from Missouri River common points (Council Bluffs to Kansas City inclusive) also St. Paul and Minneapolis, rates will be \$60, St. Louis \$69 and Denver, Colo- rado Springs and Pueblo \$50. Rates to Spokane and points effected will be \$5 less than to the coast. Rates one way via California will be \$13.50 higher than those above mentioned. Tickets will be on sale daily, June 1st to September 15, 1907, with final return limit of October 31, 1907.

**MORE CANNERIES NEEDED**

"The present season," said Mr. Mal- boen, "has been noticeable for one of the biggest crops of berries and cherries on record. Favorable conditions through- out western Oregon have made the yield a large one. Within the past two years, the people of the valley have planted large numbers of blackberries, rasp- berries and other fruit roots, largely with the view of marketing the fruit in Port- land. The very large yield this Summer exceeds the most sanguine expectations, and the Portland market was oversup- plied. Nearly 1,000 tons of cherries alone were shipped from the Willamette Valley to the Puget Sound canneries, as the western Oregon canneries could not handle the crop.

Realizing the conditions, and with the desire to encourage an industry so well suited to the climate of western Oregon, the Southern Pacific Company is foster- ing in every way the cultivation of small fruits and the establishment of canning establishments.

This work is bringing results. A number of canning establishments will be erected within a short time. At present there are two fruit canneries at Port- land, and others at Salem, Springfield, Eugene and Ashland, and others have been started this year at Grants Pass, Brownsville, Monmouth and Lebanon. The Salem plant is to be enlarged, the Eugene canneries has been improved, and the arrangements have been made to es- tablish another large cannery at Salem and another at Newberg.
