In his Nashville speech, President Roosevelt gave utterance to the following sentiment, which is self explanatory: "There has been trouble in the stock market, in the high financial world during the last few months. The statement has frequently been made that the policies for which I stand, legislative and executive, are responsible for that trouble. Now, these policies of mine can be summed up in one brief sentence. They represent the effort to punish successful dishonesty. I doubt if these policies have had any material effect in bringing about the present trouble, but if they have, it will not alter in the slightest degree my determination that for the remaining 16 months of my term these policies shall be persevered in unswervingly."
