



Dear Sir: In reply to your letter of the 4th inst. I am glad to be
able to report that the result obtained from the use of your Phoenis
Spray were very satisfactory, indeed I tested it by diluting one to
fifteen. The diluted sprays were applied thoroughly and favorably to
frees that were simply incrusted, and even a weaker solution has
apparently completely eradicated the post from sprayed trees. I find
that examination made about two weeks ago failed to reven any living
