NEW NEWSPAPER RULING

The Postal Department, on December 4th, issued a ruling to the effect that on and after January 1st, all newspapers, in order to be transmissible through the mails, at present pound rates, must be paid for in advance. Daily papers are allowed three months in which to make the change from a credit to a cash, or paid in advance basis, and weekly papers one year. This gives the weekly newspapers one year to get upon a cash in advance basis. The newspaper man who will be obliged to pay postage on a large number of delinquent subscribers, will be placed at a great financial disadvantage. This will force all publishers in the United States to go upon a cash basis within a year.
