One of the appropriations passed by the last legislature, was the item raising the state appropriation for the Oregon State University, from \$47,500 to \$125,000 annually. The referendum has been called on this appropriation, and the voters will be called upon to say whether or not the appropriation shall stand. The judgment of the Argus is, that it ought to be voted down. The only college for which the state should be taxed, is the Oregon Agricultural College. Another appropriation upon which the referendum will be invoked is the one which provides \$25,000 a year, for four years, to build armories for the state militia. The representatives from this county voted against both the above items.

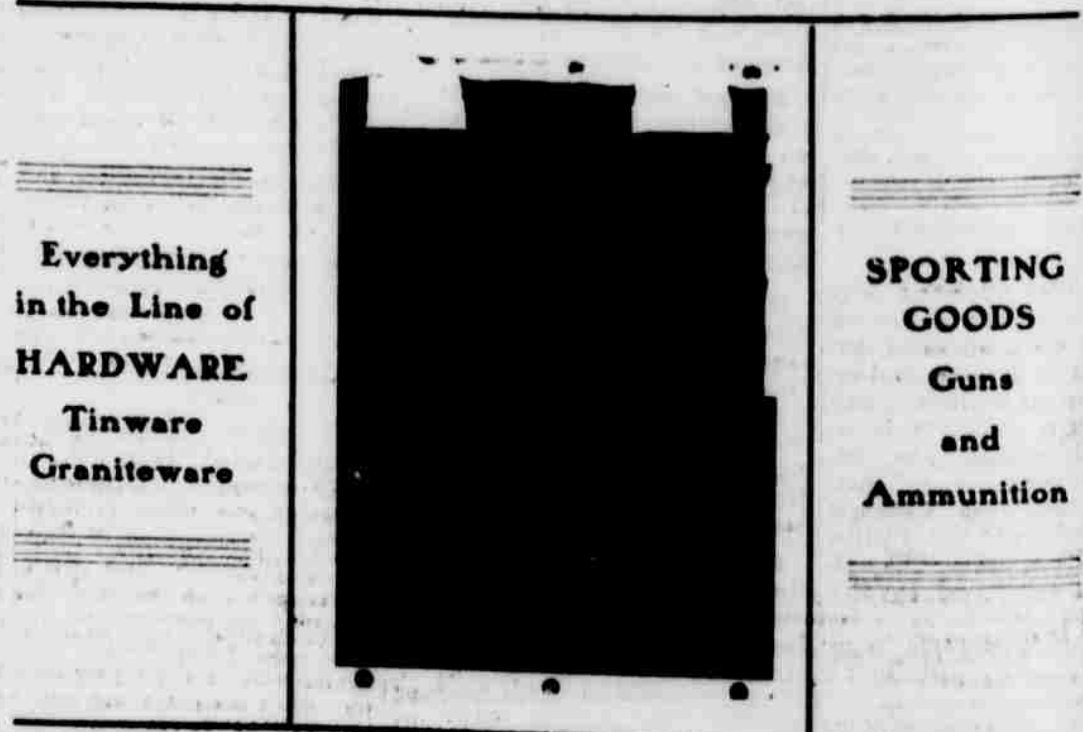
