"Maggie" is the dam of "Lord Lovelace," 2:10, contending horse in a race 2:06; "Portia Knight," 2:10 1/2, contender in a race, 2:12 1/2; and "Ben Bolt," record to a wagon, 2:18, trial, 2:11. "Maggie" is sired by "Dance Prince," second dam, "Frankie" by "Oregon Pathfinder," sire of the dam of Aliso, 2:09 1/2, and "Pathmark," 2:09 1/2, the sire of "Pathmark," 2:11.
