Grover Cleveland, America's only ex-President, died yesterday.

Wm. H. Taft, of Ohio, was nominated for the presidency on the republican ticket by the Chicago convention last Thursday, and on the day following, J. S. Sherman, of New York, was chosen for vice president. Taft's nomination was a foregone conclusion, and Sherman's nomination is intended to strengthen the ticket in New York. Many republicans would have preferred Roosevelt, but his decision not to be a candidate, settled the matter.
