A Hillsboro man, who is an enthusiast on aerial navigation, predicts that within ten years people will use the aeroplane as a means of travel in Hillsboro. This is an age of great things, and he may be a true prophet.

Hillsboro's talk about electric railway connection with Portland, for many years, is about to become a fact. It is confidently expected that cars will be in operation between Hillsboro and the metropolis, by the first of next month.

The sound of the hammer is heard in Hillsboro, from early morn until evening time. A great many new residences are going up, and many new comers are settling in our midst, all of which indicate a healthy growth, and a greater one than Hillsboro ever before enjoyed. Let the good work go on.

Do not forget to bring the best specimens of agricultural growth from the farm, for the Hillsboro Street Fair. The exhibit made last year was highly creditable, but the showing this year should be better. With the completion of the electric line, the Fair ought to have ten thousand visitors, many of them from outside counties.

The "good roads" convention, which met in Portland this week, is the beginning of active work all over the state for better highways. The 200 delegates who attended the meeting will be the leaven which will ferment the work, and farmers and others will come to see that better roads will be worth the effort and the expense. Washington county has very little gravel, the soil being a rich, deep black loam, with the result that road building is a hard proposition. We must get the gravel or crushed rock to put on the top of our black soil before we can hope to have good roads. With the advent of the electric lines, the County Board will be able to have rock brought from its quarries, and ship in gravel at a figure that will justify its use. The recent ruling by the postoffice department, that better roads must be had or the rural delivery discontinued, makes improved roads imperative. Road building is getting to be a science, and it can easily be demonstrated in Oregon that the best roads are the cheapest.

The streets and portions of streets to be leveled and planked are as follows: Main street between Third street and Fifth street and between Eighth street and Tenth street and the east half of that portion of Main street between Sixth street and Seventh street, Second street between Lincoln street and Edson street and the south half of Second street between Oak street and Fir street. Base line street between First street and Second street, all in Hillsboro, Oregon, and that it is proposed to apportion the cost of such street improvements as follows: One-fourth thereof to be borne by the owners of lots or parcels of land abutting upon and adjacent to said streets where said improvements are made and the remaining three-fourths to be borne by the City of Hillsboro, and that the City Council will hear and determine objections, if any, to said proposed street improvements at its next regular meeting, to-wit: September 1, 1908, at 8 o'clock p. m.

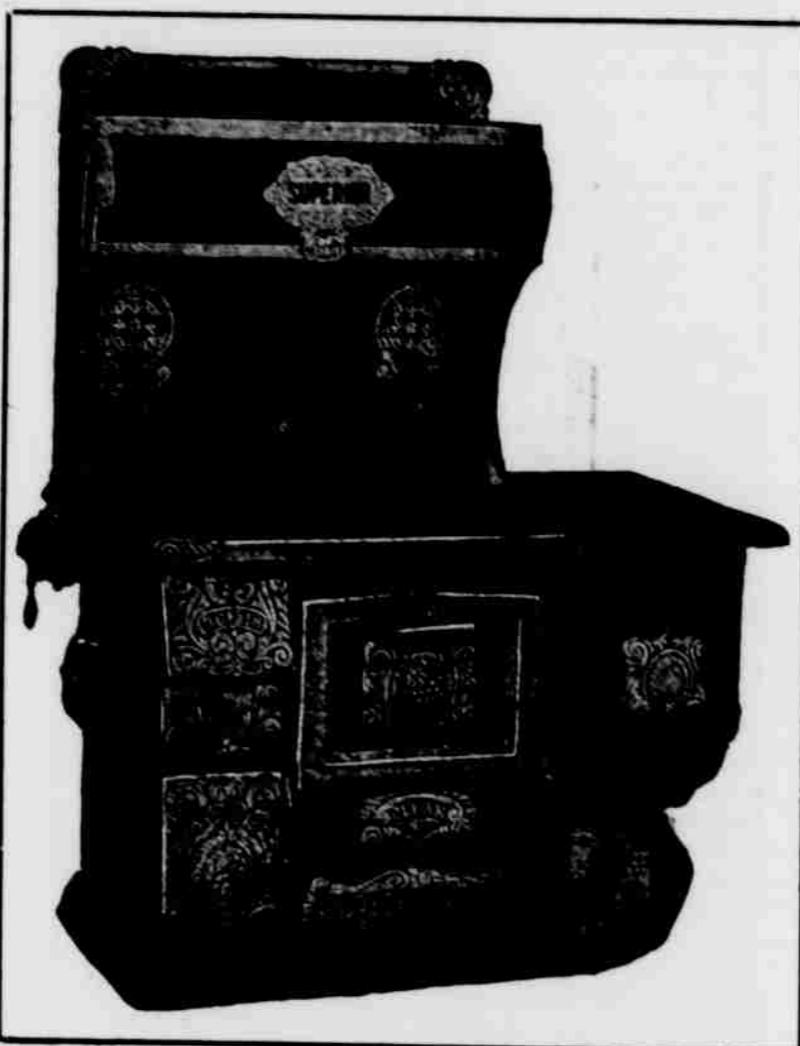
