Notice of Proposed Street Improvements Notice is hereby given that the City Council of the City of Hillsboro, Oregon, proposes to order that the portions of the streets of the City of Hillsboro hereinafter

metel be planked with good solid fir planks, 16 feet long, 3 inches thick and 12 inches wide, said planks to be laid cross-wise upon 3 stringers, each stringer to be 6 inches wide and 4 inches thick, by securely nailing all of said planks and stringers, each of said planks to be nailed to each stringer with 4 1/2 inch spikes, 2 spikes to each bearing, said streets to be first leveled before planking.
