G. E. Johnson, of Johnson's sawmill, south of town, has bought the Hunt property on 8th and Baseline, and will move to town this week. Mr. Johnson is not very stout since his injury at his mill some time ago, and will retire from hard work.

The city's new water tower is completed. The structure is of steel and the frame is 75 feet high. The tank is of wood, and holds 30,000 gallons. This gives the city a reserve of 60,000 gallons, with its old tank, and greatly aids safety in case of conflagration.

Frank Rowell, of Scholls, who was in town Monday, says that \$1600 of the \$2000 required for a preliminary survey of the country between Tigardville and Blooming, for the Oregon Electric line, has been subscribed, and that the balance will easily be raised.

C. F. Eichenberger, of Wineburg, Northern Ohio, arrived here this week, and is a guest of his old schoolmate, C. Blaser. Mr. Eichenberger is an experienced dairyman and cheese maker, and is looking over this county with a view to locating, and going into business.

Geo. Schulmerich, cashier of the Commercial Bank, received a Bank of England five pound note, the other day, in the course of business, the first ever handled by that bank. It somewhat resembles in appearance, one of the fiat money panic certificates issued by the Portland Clearance House, last Fall.

Mrs. Jane Smith and daughter, Miss Elisabeth, went to Portland last Saturday, to visit a day or two with the Misses Tannoch, of Scotland, who spent the Summer with their brother, Allen Tannoch, of near Glencoe, and other relatives in this state. The Misses Tannoch started for their home across the ocean, Monday.

The home team won from North Pacific Lumber Company at Beaverton, last Sunday, by heavy batting. Both pitchers were hit freely. Davis for Beaverton struck out 14. Inram's playing at short for the home side was phenomenal. The score was 7 to 5. Batteries—Davis and Schuld for Beaverton; Bergman and Saub for N. P. L. Co.

A number of our citizens went crabbing Sunday, with varying luck. Anent the subject, it is stated that the Tualatin river furnishes fully one-half of all the crabfish consumed in the Portland market, and that the Tualatin product is the finest known, in the Northwest. These fresh water crabs bring 18c per dozen in the Portland market, and used to sell for 35c a dozen, a few years ago. Regular fishermen use a seine, and frequently get 60 or 75 dozens a day.

Last Thursday afternoon, while Webster Trump was operating the log pulling machine at the Oregon Nursery sawmill, he accidentally got a hand in the gearing of the machine, and stood a good show to be drawn into the cog and crushed to death. With rare presence of mind, however, he reached with the disengaged hand, and seizing the lever shut off the power. The men about the mill, then reversed the machinery slowly, and got the man's hand out. Mr. Trump was brought to town, where Dr. A. B. Bailey, assisted by Dr. F. A. Bailey, amputated two of the mangled fingers, and dressed the other part of the wound.

How Sia, a Chinese, aged 62 years, fell from a hop house Saturday on the Gore estate last Saturday, a distance of about 20 feet, crushing his skull, and killing him. The yard is near Sherwood. Coroner Brown went down to the scene of the Sin's death, and made an examination, which convinced him that the Chinaman's death was accidental, and he therefore did not hold an inquest. Sin's cousin, Sing Bin, has the hop yard leased. As soon as it was found that How Sin was dead, his brethren erected little mounds of earth, upon which they placed burning punks, the object being to keep the "devil" away. The remains were taken to Portland for burial.
