Commencing at a point on the Base Line, 352 chs. West of the quarter Section corner of the South boundary line of Section 34, T. 1 N., R. 2 W., where the East boundary line of the Elam Young Donation Land Claim Number 45, T. 1 N., R. 2 W., of the Will. Mer. intersects the said Base Line, and running thence West on Base Line, 23.72 chs., to the West line of the East 1/2 of the said Elam Young Claim; thence North 1 deg. West on the West line of the East 1/2 of said Young D. L. C., 21.08 chs., to the East 1/2 of said Young D. L. C.; thence South 1 deg. East, 21.08 chs., to the place of beginning, containing 30 acres, more or less.

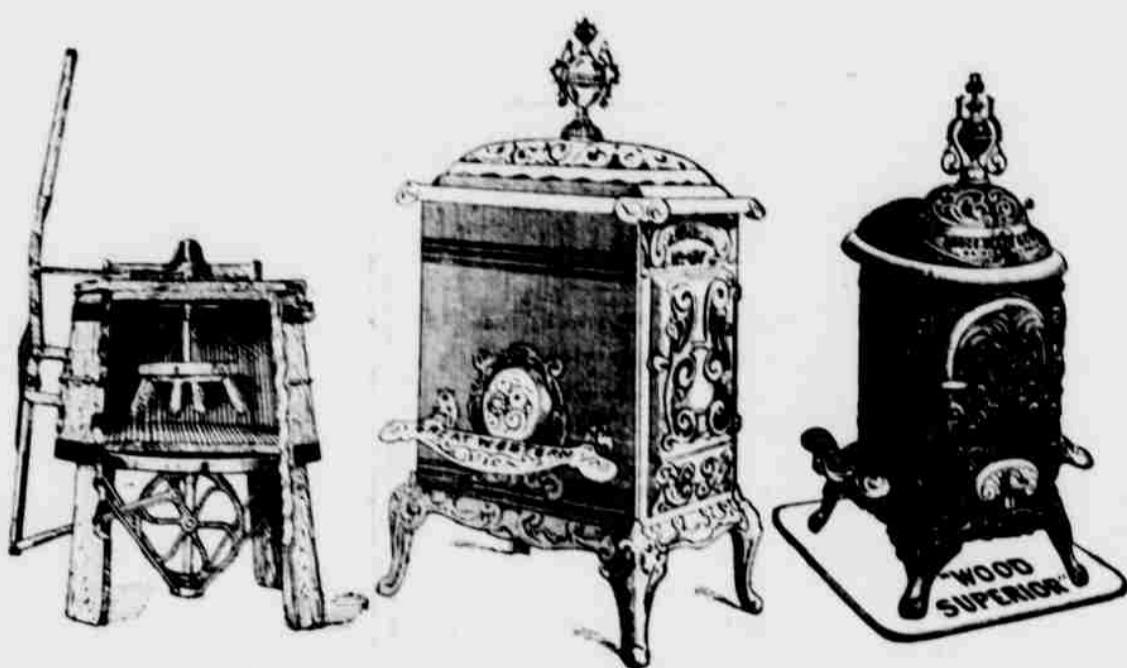
