After the valuations for 1908, as originally made by Assessor Wilcox, were corrected by the Board of Equalization, they were found to foot \$5,320 less. This decrease in the valuation for Washington county for the year 1908 was due to a re-cruise of the timber land of the county. The original gross valuation, as returned by the Assessor to the Board of Equalization, was \$12,558,988. As revised, the figures are \$12,553,668. The tax levy will be made by the County Board at the January term, when the roll will be turned over to the Sheriff for collection.

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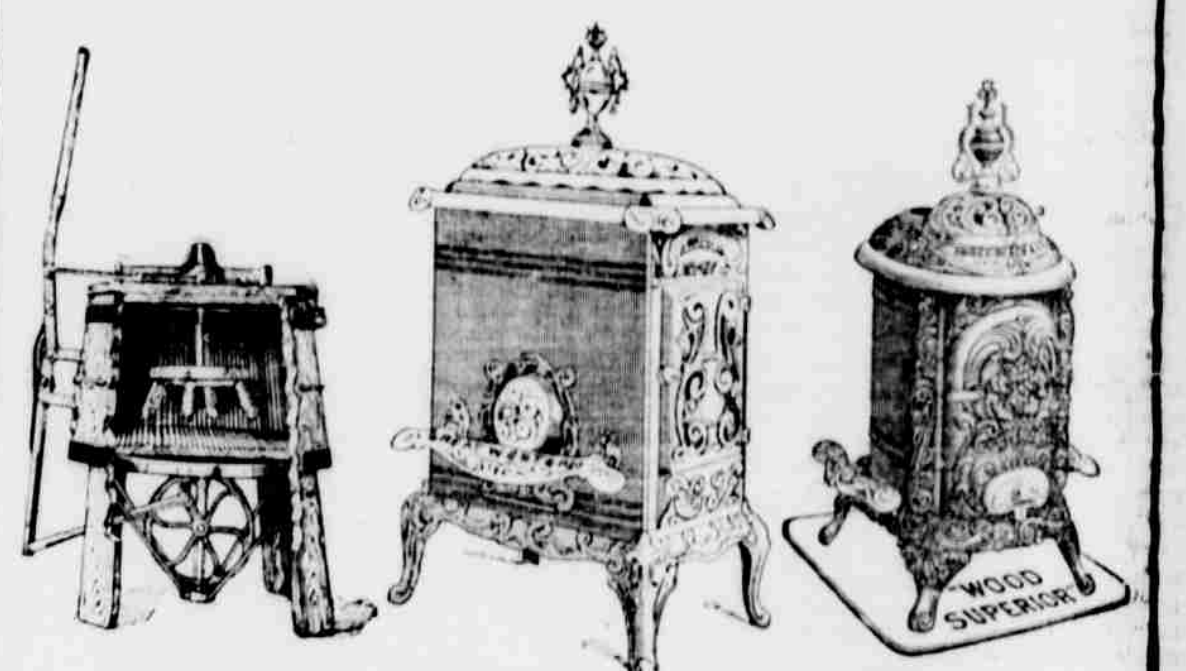
