Dorr Waggener Chief Instrument Man on United

SAYS ROAD WILL SURELY BUILD

Worked up From Axman to Transit Man in Few Years

Dorr Waggener, son of Rufus Waggener and wife, formerly of the Hotel Tualatin, was in town over Sunday. Waggener is chief instrument man on the United Railways in the tunnel district, and ran the lines for both portals. Several years ago he went out with the Pacific Railway & Navigation Company on their Tillamook line, as axman, and by close application to his work gradually advanced until he was given a level. Later he went to work for the United with a level crew, and was then advanced to transit work. Dorr says that the United means business, and there is plenty of capital behind the promoters. The contractors, themselves, are worth considerable money, enough perhaps, to build the line, and as it traverses a very rich section, it will get all kinds of business.

Work is still in progress down to Linnton, and operation of trains will soon begin. Work will be conducted on the tunnel all winter, and the company expects to reach Hillsboro by midsummer. A. B.
