PORTLAND MAN FILES ON SCOGGINS CREEK

Water of Last Stream in County Appropriated

C. H. GOSSETT FILES THE RIGHT

To be Utilized for Agricultural and Domestic Purposes

C. H. Gossett, of Portland, this week, filed in the County Recorder's office a water right on Scoggins creek, the last available stream for the purpose in Washington county.

Water rights have been filed on North and South Dairy, Tualatin, McKay, and Gales creeks, during the past three months. Gossett claims in his filing an appropriation of 1,000 miner inches, under a six inch pressure, the water to be diverted from the right bank at a point which bears south 33 degrees, 1880 feet from the section corner of sections 22, 23, 27 and 28, township 1 south, range 4 west of the Will. Mer., by means of a diverting dam 10 feet high, flumes and ditches to extend in a southeasterly direction from the point of diversion; ditches to be 4 feet wide at the bottom, and 10 feet wide at the water surface, and to carry 2 feet of water with a grade of one foot in 250 feet.

The water is appropriated for domestic and agricultural purposes. The available flow is 25 cubic feet per second, and the project favors of a summer irrigation scheme.
