GEN. MANAGER TALBOT REPLIES

Takes Exception to Criticisms, and States His Position

General Manager Talbot, of the Oregon Electric, appears to think that his company has received some unjust criticism, and he asks space for the letter which follows.

Several times recently the Forest Grove papers have been publishing articles criticizing the Oregon Electric Railway Company and mentioning them with responsibility of the Southern Pacific Company's action in withdrawing a cheap commutation rate they had in effect prior to our entrance into that city.

We have been operating over a year in Salem, and during that time the Southern Pacific Co. have had sharp commutation rates to Bertha, Siskiyou, Klamath, Deschutes and other points, outside of the villages themselves.

We are extremely grateful to the committee and the subscribers to the right of way fund that brought us into Forest Grove, and had it not been for their public spirited criticism we would not have attempted to build into Forest Grove for the past year.

Our company has constructed a railroad equal to any standard steam railroad in the country, using the best of material, heavy steel and the best of equipment.

It is our aim, before another year passes, to get our road thoroughly ballasted and in as good a shape as the main line, and, if the traffic at all warrants, to have a train between Portland and Forest Grove every hour, or hour and thirty minutes.
