Miss Mary Ann Simpson, of Yorkshire, England, a former resident of Hillsboro, sends the Argus a copy of the London Daily News of April 30th, which contains "a people's budget" introduced in parliament by Lloyd George, which provides for relief for the poor; taxation of the rich; 16,000,000 from land, licenses and incomes; workmen's insurance; motors to pay for the roads; extension of old age pensions; money for afforestation and agriculture.

The United Railways Co has let a contract for 1800 feet at the west end of the tunnel on the Cornelius Pass, and has purchased the timber to be used in construction from S. M. Tunstall, who lives near at hand. The Company has nearly all of the right of way, as far west as Glencoe, but there is no grading in progress, thus far. Most of the horses and a lot of oats purchased on the Plains last Fall, have been removed to Portland, which does not look as if the Company expected to do much in this county, this summer.
