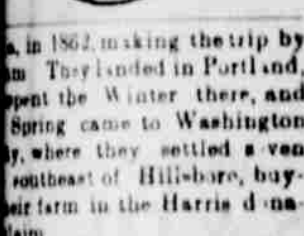


OLD PIONEER DIES AT FARMINGTON HOME
