### SUICIDE AT DILLEY

Mrs. Mary Jane Buckingham, aged 55 years, and wife of George Buckingham, suicided at her home in Dilley, the last of the week, by taking concentrated lye. Her husband survives her. They owned a ranch a distance from Dilley, and it is popularly supposed that Mrs. Buckingham was worrying over something connected with the farm, which was occupied by a renter, Rudolph by name, who has the reputation of being a good tenant. The funeral took place Sunday, and the aged husband has gone to Portland to reside with a son-in-law for a short time.
