J. L. Simpson, who came here from Hood River, a few months ago, and bought a 20-acre tract in South Tualatin, near the James place, was in town Saturday. Mr. Simpson says that this county can raise apples that will discount Hood River for juice and flavor, if orchards will be given the care that the plateau people give their trees.

Geo. Hathorn, of Laurel, was in Monday, and brought in with him some Early Rose potato tubers, which bore perfect potatoes—a dozen of them—on the vines, as well as some fine tubers on the roots. It is saying something for Laurel soil when it is so fertile that it produces potatoes on both ends of the vine. He found several vines which produced in this manner.

J. T. Morrison, who is experimenting with irrigation to his profit, on his ranch below the Harris Bridge, was in Monday morning, accompanied by his son, Charlie, who has been brakeman on the railroad at the government jetty, at Hammond. Chas. reports the Hillsboro boys at the jetty as getting along finely. Ed. Adkins is still firing on the engine, and Frank Wallace still has charge of the work.

Adam Bell, the Centerville blacksmith, was in the last of the week, and reports that Emil Crop, of that section, recently lost a team of young horses, for which he had been offered \$500, and Mr. Bell lost a two-year-old colt, which he valued at \$150. The horses were in Emil Crop's pasture, and there were 14 head in all. In some manner they broke into a field which had a lot of threshed wheat in sacks. Eating of the grain founded them, and although Dr. Knox, the Forest Grove veterinarian, was called, the animals died within two days. The loss is a severe one on each of the owners.
