MRS. SMITH LOSES HER HORSE CASE

Wanted \$2,000 for Damages to Horse, Starlight

DIST. ATTORNEY TONGUE SCORES Peculiar Wording of Statute Ends Celebrated Case

District Attorney E B Tongue gained a decision from Judge Campbell, Tuesday, that has a world of significance. Mrs. Smith wife of the pugilist, "Mysterious Billy Smith," had sued Washington County for \$2,000 for damages alleged to have been sustained by horse, Starlight, through its being injured in a defective bridge down in one of the Cedar precincts, last Fall. The county court turned down the claim and her attorneys appealed to the circuit court.

District Attorney Tongue held that the statute gave damages only to a person wherein the owner was with the injured property at the time of the damage. Judge Campbell held with the opinion and the case was thrown out of court.

Mr. Tongue says there is a Supreme Court case which practically upholds this decision, although his particular feature of the case was not brought out in arriving at the opinion. The court, however, held that the language of the law was clear and this being the case Judge Campbell is not very likely to be reversed. It seems peculiar, however, that a man can not collect for an injury to an animal on highway, even if someone else were driving at the time. But such is the statute.
