TUNNEL CAVES IN AND BRINGS FATALITY

Robert Mosby Smothered in Earth Above Timber, on Railway

DEAD MAN ABOUT 28 YEARS OF AGE

Coroner E. C. Brown Went to Scene of Accident, Tuesday

A cave-in of a tunnel on construction work on the Pacific Railway & Navigation line, five miles from Timber, Monday afternoon, resulted in the death of Robert Mosby, aged 28 years, who was smothered by the volume of earth. Two other men were in the excavation, but were able to get out with no serious injury. Mosby worked on the Tillamook line 18 months ago, but left and went to the DesChutes, and later went to Alaska. A brother, Geo. Mosby, was located, and arrived in Hillsboro, yesterday, and went on out to the front to take care of the remains of the unfortunate man.


