WORK PUSHED ON BEAVERTON CUT-OFF

Expects Trains to be Running on Line by Winter Time

ALL HEAVY TRAINS TO BE ROUTED

Road From Portland to Forest Grove to be Electrified

The Southern Pacific, owing to the popular discontent in Portland, over heavy trains running upon Fourth Street, is pushing work as rapidly as possible on the bridge across the Willamette which is to be the crossing of the Beaverton-Willsburg cut-off. All heavy freight and passenger trains are to be routed on the new line.

It now looks as though the line from Portland to Forest Grove will be electrified and cars operated so as to reach the center of both Hillsboro and the College City. The S. P. attorneys are preparing a petition to the Portland council, asking for a franchise to electrify Fourth street.

EMMOTT-ANDERSON

Alfred Emmott and Adelle A. Anderson, both of North Hillsboro, were united in marriage at the home of the groom's son, Homer Emmott, Sunday, May 1, 1910, at High Noon, Rev. M. F. Horn officiating. The will of Frederick William David, for years owner of David's Hill, above Forest Grove, has been filed in probate. While there are some serious internal injuries, the physician thinks he will recover.

The blaze was caused by a defective flue, and the house loss was from \$800 to \$1,000. Mr. Spiesschaert lost a lot of their furniture, their silverware, and last, but not least, about \$150 worth of smoked hams and shoulders.
