SATURDAY, MAY 14 SET AS CLEAN-UP DAY

Council Co-Operates With the State Authorities on Sanitation

ALL ARE ASKED TO GET BUSY

Wagons Will be Furnished to Haul Away all Rubbish Gathered

Saturday, May 14, 1910, has been named as "clean-up day" by the city council, and the old town will follow the date set by the State Woman's Clubs in this regard. A few hours of work will make a great difference in the appearance of Hillsboro, and the city has agreed to furnish teams for hauling away rubbish and debris that may be gathered and piled at the edge of the streets. A committee from the Coffee Club requested the city fathers to take the matter up with the citizens, and the order has gone out that all shall take a few hours off and get ready for a general toilet of the city's back yards and alleys. The official order reads:

OFFICIAL NOTICE

To Citizens of Hillsboro:—You are hereby notified by the Mayor and City Council that May 14 is State Cleaning-up Day, and each and all of you are requested to clean your premises, mow the weeds, clean the alleys, burn the rubbish, pull down old fences, sack or box all rubbish that will not burn, and place as conveniently as possible for the wagons that will be furnished free of charge to haul this away, Saturday, May 14.

Those who do not heed this notice will be called upon by the City Marshal.
