COMET AND ECLIPSE FURNISH PHENOMENA

Old Luna Goes Under the Shadow of the Earth

HUNDREDS VIEWED HALLEY'S COMET

Celestial Visitor Seen in Western Heavens, Alpha and Omega

You may live to be a thousand years old and yet never witness the peculiar conditions seen in the heavens Monday night, when the shadow of earth eclipsed the moon—a beautiful and spectacular sight—and gave one a chance to see Halley's comet in the Western sky. The eclipse of the moon started about nine o'clock and lasted over an hour. The comet was plainly seen over the coast range, to the west. The head was plainly visible and had been for several evenings and the tail was rather dim, extending upward and to the left, about 35 degrees. It did not present so beautiful a sight as Comet A 1910, which appeared in the Western sky last Fall, but it was the best sight obtainable since the visitor started its transit. The evening was delightful, and all could witness both demonstrations without discomfort.
