### COUNTY MAKES DEAL WITH OREGON ELECTRIC

Will Lay Track Into Nyberg Quarry at Tualatin

ROCK TO HILLSBORO BY JUNE 20

Good Road Work Will Then Begin at This Point to Country

Judge Goodin announces that the county court has made an arrangement with John F. Stevens, of the Hill lines, to have a track laid into the Nyberg quarry at Tualatin, at a very close date, the county to do the grading and furnish the ties; the railway company to furnish and lay the steel and hand the overhead wires and set the poles. The company will then give a graduated rate to points in Washington County, and it is estimated that shipment per ton to Hillsboro will cost about 50 cents per ton.

The grading amounts to nothing, as the road down which the line will be built is a level grade. Construction is to begin at once, and it is confidently expected that rock will be shipped by the above date.

Rock will also be hauled to South Cornelius and South Forest Grove. The work at Hillsboro will be: The county road from the P. R. & N. track on Baseline to the top of the Jobe's hill, west of town; from the condenser to the bridge; some work on the road in South Tualatin; the road from the Billings' corner on to the Crow place northwest of the city; and from the foot of Main street on past the P. M. Jackson farm.

The Judge thinks that about three miles in all will be built here this season.

### THOS. LAWSON SUED

Thos. Lawson—not the Thos. Lawson of Frenzied Finance Fame—has been sued by the United Railways for the delivery of contracts which he procured from Gales Creek parties some time ago, giving him the exclusive right to take out gravel and sand from Gales Creek and tributaries for railway ballast. Lawson took the contracts in his own name, according to the complaints, representing to the owners of the gravel that he was to assign them to the company. The United says that he now refuses to surrender the contracts and assign them properly, although they allege that he was their agent in procuring the instruments. A. E. Clark represents the company as counsel and Thos. Lawson is to be held in circuit court forthwith. The company asks that the court's decree stand in lieu of an assignment.

Lawson procured a great deal of right of way for the United from Glencoe on over to Gales Creek, and the right of way deeds went to the United. The gravel contracts, however, were put in his own name. He procured contract rights from John Heisler, Cicero Hines, Jos. Lee, John DeMoss and Elijah S. McCoy, all of whom are made co-defendants so that the case may be made clear to the court. Thos. has not yet answered the complaints of the United.

L. C. Kinser, who came here from Texas two years ago, and who bought the Henderson place, near the Tualatin Plains church, has sold the ranch to the Losli brothers, who recently sold their acreage near Orenco. Mr. Kinser likes Oregon better than any place he has ever lived in, but sold on account of rheumatism. The Loslis will convert the place into a dairy farm.

The State's brief in the Roselair case is now printed, and is in the hands of District Attorney E. B. Tongue and his deputy, Thos. H. Tongue. The book is a 92-page affair and bristles with points and authorities. Attorney Jeffrey based the foundation of his appeal on the testimony of Dr. A. B. Bailey, but as his testimony was only corroborative of other evidence, and to which Jeffrey had no exception, it looks as though Roselair has rather a poor chance to get the case reversed.
