## SOUTHERN PACIFIC TO HAUL ROCK FOR COUNTY

Contract is for Delivery Inside 25 Mile Limit at 25 Cents

WILL INCLUDE HILLSBORO STATION

Rock to be Hauled From Oswego on Beaverton Cut-Off

The Southern Pacific will put in a spur at the Oswego rock quarry and negotiations are now pending for the hauling of rock to Hillsboro, Cornelius and Forest Grove. The rate is understood to be 25 cents per ton, and the agreement has been figured by the S. P. freight department. It now has but the recommendation of Supt. O'Brien, and then track will be laid at once; the crusher installed, and shipments begun.

The above rate for hauling is one-half what the Oregon Electric is supposed to desire to charge, and County Commissioners McClaran and Butner, who declined making a contract with the Electric, feel satisfied, as they say this will save several hundred of dollars for those who are paying the special tax. They denounce what they deem as aspersions cast upon them in an article in the Hillsboro Independent, and say that they are satisfied to rest their case with the taxpayers. They aver that they had no personal reasons for not signing up with the Oregon Electric, but declined, so they say, because the Electric people wanted them to sign their franchises in the county before they would proceed with the freight hauling; and had further reason for declining, because the Electric had not lived up to its original agreement in fixing up crossings at all points—notably the Garden Home crossing, toward Beaverton; and still another for the reason that the road had not given the public a highway in Tualatin as large as it was before the county gave them a strip for their track, and for which they were to give the county, for road purposes, an equal amount of land.
