HENRY G. GUILD LANDS RECEIVERSHIP

President Sends in Nomination to Senate Monday Morning

OPPOSITION OF CONGRESSMEN FAILS

New Appointee Goes to Vale, Oregon, Land Office

Notwithstanding Congressmen Hawley and Ellis both opposed the appointment of Henry G. Guild to the receivership of the new land office at Vale, Oregon, carrying a salary of \$3,000 per year, the President, Monday morning, sent in the nomination to the Senate, and this ends the controversy. Mr. Guild will take possession of the office just as soon as the supplies come from Washington, D. C.

Guild is yet at Newport, where he recently sold the Newport Signal, which he edited after leaving the Argus, which he conducted for 20 months. Guild is very well qualified for the position, and will make a good official. He still owns his residence in Hillsboro, located on First Street, and now occupied by Dr. Reagan.

H. G. Guild was in the legislature which was denominated the "hold-up" body, and there made the acquaintance of Senator Bourne. He stood with Bourne and Simon all through the fight and this is what put him in touch with Bourne. He had been elected from Yamhill County as a silver republican in the memorable fight when the silverites cleaned up that county.

The senate has confirmed the appointment and Guild will file his bond and take charge July 1.
