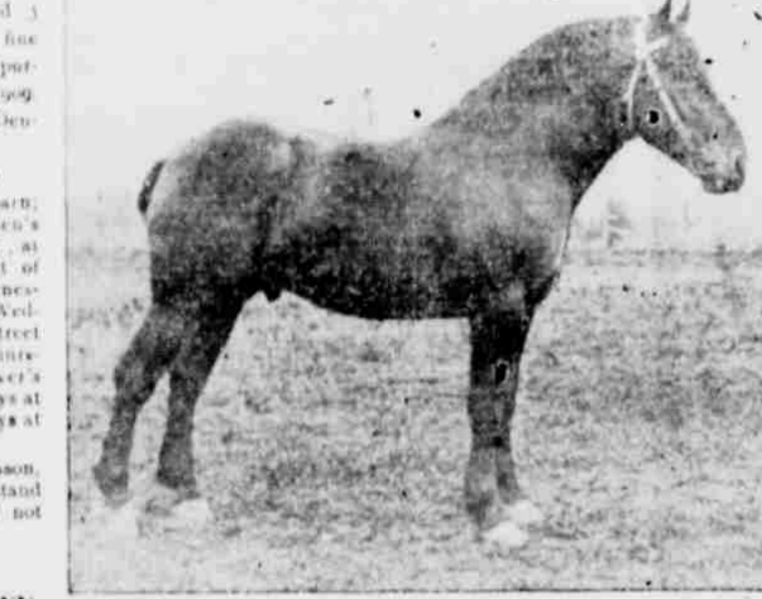

## ROSELAIR HEARING HELD YESTERDAY

Condemned Man's Case Before Supreme Court and Argued

WILL BE DECIDED IN FEW WEEKS

Murderer Must Then be Returned for Sentence of Trial

District Attorney E. B. Tongue went to Salem, Tuesday, and yesterday argued against a new trial being granted the wife-slayer, John D. Roselair. Mr. Tongue fortified his case with a 90-page brief, one of the most exhaustive ever printed in a

criminal case out of Washington County. The case in all probability will be decided within a fortnight, and if it shall go against Roselair, he will be remanded back to Hillsboro for sentence. Should he be granted a new trial, however, he will then be returned here for the court to go over the evidence again.

Roselair killed his wife May 15, 1909; surrendered to Sheriff Hancock May 16, at 6:00 o'clock in the morning; remained in jail until December term of circuit court; the jury was sworn in December 15; the jury returned a verdict of guilty December 21; Judge Campbell sentenced him on December 27, the penalty to be hanging, and the date of execution set for Friday, February 11. On February 4, Jeffreys asked for a new trial, which was denied, and on February 9, he appeared before the Supreme Court and asked for a stay of execution, which was granted.

Roselair has thus been over 13 months in durance and he keeps up writing letters to the district attorney, still contending that his wife provoked the assault and that after she threw the milk in his face, followed by the pan, he blindly struck out with the big fish knife, and missed the neck. He says this blow struck her neck, and he saw she was mortally wounded and then his mind became a blank.

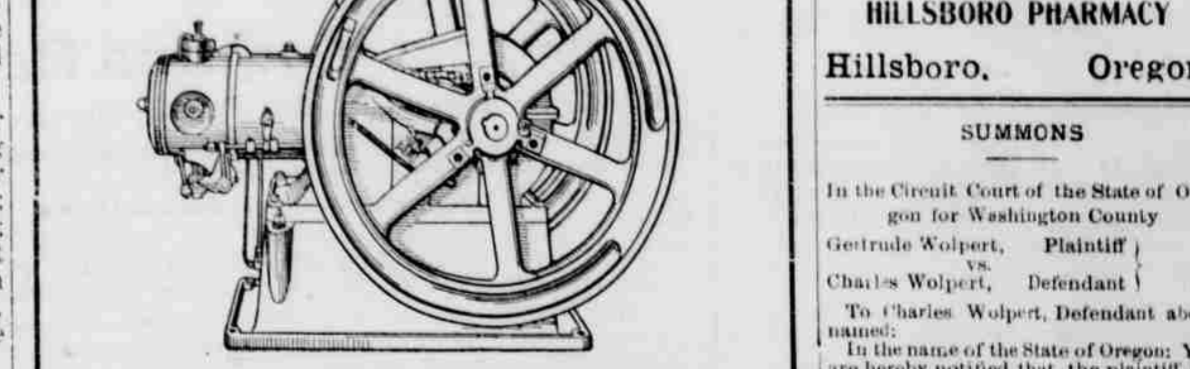
