Porter Bros. Get First Big Contract Out of Portland

WILL BORE CORNELIUS GAP TUNNEL

Expect to Make Tillamook in 80 Miles From Portland

After having control of the United Railways James J. Hill has at this early date set things rolling by letting the first 24 miles of grading to Porter Brothers, who have already rushed men to the work. This will carry the line into Washington County and very close to the Tillamook County line. The Cornelius gap tunnel is inside the contract, and boring will begin at once. Porter Bros, expect to clean up the 24 miles by the time the rain falls and track will be laid as rapidly as the grade and bridges are finished.

The switch back will be used temporarily until the tunnel is completed and inside of 90 days and perhaps sooner cars should be running past Glencoe. There are five surveying corps on the line between Banks and Portland. and the line is permanently le cated.

While there is talk of the line getting to Tillamook before the Lytle road connects this is considered nonsense by those who know the character of the heavy work through the Coast range, If the line finishes into Tillamook by the end of 1911 it will have been a remarkable feat in railroad construction, for it will mean 70 miles, nearly of heavy work, The line between the summit at Cornelius Gap and Cedar Canyon, of course, is not very heavy but a few miles out of Banks begins some exceptionally heavy work, The tunnel will not be completed before January 1 according to present estimates and this will probably mean more time than that which has been allotted.
