CHURCH PARSONAGES **MUST BE ASSESSED**

State Tax Commission so Notifies Assessor Crandall

SEVERAL TO BE TAXED IN CITY

Also Several to go on the Roll at Forest tirove

In the past church parsonages have not been placed on the tax roll, but hereafter it is to be different, according to a ruling of the state tax commission. The commission has written Assessor Max Crandall that it expects him to place on the tax roll all church property that is not used generally as a house of worship, and make it mandatory that all church parsonages are taxable property, whether occupied by ministers, rented out, or otherwise. In other words, church property, (save and except buildings and the necessary real estate going with it, used either as schools or houses of worship) used as residences of presiding ministers must pay taxes just the same as other taxable prop-

Hillsboro has several parsonages that come under this heading. Assessor Crandall will place on the tax roll the M. E. parsonage, the Evangelical parsonage, the Christian church bungalow, and the St. Matthews residence, on the Catholic prop-

Forest Grove also has parsonages which will go on the list, and there doubtless are others in the county.

The tax commission quotes the statute applying and say there is no question that under the law these residential buildings should have been subject to taxation.
