

The Pacific Railway & Navigation Company will run one of their popular excursions to Timber on Sunday, July 17. The train will leave Hillsboro at nine in the morning and leave Timber at 5 in the evening. This will give excursionists at least six hours in the heart of the mountains, on the Nehalem river, and the trip is over a beautiful mountain run.

E. Klinger, of Tualatin, and G. A. Plieth, of Ligardville, were spending a few days in the city.


