DISTRICT ATTORNEY'S OFFICE MAKES MOVE

Deputy District Afterney Tongue Files Suit in Roselair Case

WANTS COST OF MURDER TREAL

Jeifrey, Marderer's Attorney, Served With Summons, Tuesday

Deputy District Attorney T. H. Tongue, Tuesday, filed a case in the circuit court, asking that the county be awarded its costs in the celebrated Roselair murder trial. The county's costs in the ense reached \$807.25, including the expense of fighting the appeal to the Supreme Court. The complaint asks that the farm above Buxton be sold, and the proceeds divided as follows:

First That John Ritter, of Helyetia, and who has a mortgage, be paid in full.

Second That the county of Washington be reimbursed \$807.-25 for its costs in convicting and sending Roselair to the gallows. Third-That J. A. Jeffrey deed, executed by Roselair, be then paid, and the residue, if any, be paid over to Roselair's egal heirs. Roselair's attorney will no doubt contest the case with much strenuosity, but there is a law saving that the state has a first lien against the property of a felon as it stood at the commitment of the crime.




