Big improvements are promised for Hillsboro. People are awakening to the city's commercial importance. Now a great big pull for manufacturing, and we will get into the 5,000 class before we know it.

Let us hope that special tax for road improvements will carry everywhere. A few more miles of rock road and every "man-John" will be for such improvements.

With four banks—two in business and two to come in the near future—Hillsboro shows that she is growing right along.

But six people attended the school meeting Monday—A. A. Morrill, J. P. Tamesie, A. C. Shute, directors, Peter Boscow, clerk, and B. W. Barnes and L. E. Wilkes, which is not a very good showing for a populous district. A levy of 61-2 mills was made, and it is expected that this will bring in a tax of about \$8,450. The county levy will bring in \$5,216, which will make a total of \$13,665 for running expenses and payment of interest. The new law requires districts to get their levy to the county clerk by December 12, and many districts, Hillsboro's included, are late. Clerk Bailey, however, will get an order from the county commissioners and have all the levies on the taxroll.

Aubrey P. Venen, a son of A. P. Venen and wife, of Forest Grove, was drowned yesterday, on Puget Sound, when the steamer Kitsap, in Seattle harbor, ran down and sank the Columbia, a boat on which young Venen was a passenger. The young man was a favorite with all who knew him, and his untimely death causes a sincere regret. He was a nephew of Mrs. W. R. Hoyt, of Hillsboro. The young man was a few years ago an assistant in the store of his cousin, Laurel M. Hoyt.

Hillsboro is still to have another bank, and the Controller of the Currency has approved the application of A. C. Shute, A. S. Sholes, W. Mahon, A. McGill, M. McDonald and Dr. J. P. Tamesie, to organize the American National Bank, with a capitalization of \$50,000. The incorporators will make their plans public for publication for next week.

John Lund, of Astoria, while getting off a train at Timber, Monday, slipped and fell under a car wheel of a boxcar, and suffered a laceration of his left hand. He came to Hillsboro and Dr. Norman amputated the tip of the middle finger and dressed the end of the index and third fingers, which were severely crushed. Lund had just gone to the front with some fellow Swedes to start work in a short tunnel.

Billy Wolf, teaming around the Beaverton section, was Tuesday arrested and placed in jail in default of \$200 bail, to answer the charge of not having supported a minor child. Wolf and his wife are separated, and the wife and child live at the Henry Stauffer home in East Hillsboro.

FIRE DESTROYS TWO MAIN ST. BUILDINGS

Frost Millinery Parlor and Contents Lost, Monday Afternoon.

W. G. HARE LOSES HIS RESIDENCE

Home Total Loss, But Much Furniture Was Saved By Neighbors.

The store building owned and occupied by Mrs. Frost as a millinery, caught fire Monday afternoon about 4 o'clock and the structure was gutted by the flames and the building itself is nearly a total loss. Mr. and Mrs. Frost departed from Hillsboro on the 10:45 train for Heppner, that morning, and there was no one in the building. The department did remarkably well considering that the interior was all aflame before the fire was discovered. The woodwork on the cement block building occupied by Gross caught fire around the windows of the Tamesie offices and the chemical saved it from further spread. The building and contents were insured in the sum of \$1,200. It is expected that Mrs. Frost will start building in the near future.

Mr. and Mrs. Frost resided in the rear of the building, and their clothing was a total loss, except that which they wore on their trip. They were in Portland when the fire took place, and returned the next morning, upon being advised of their loss. At ten o'clock last evening an alarm was turned in for a fire at the home of Attorney W. G. Hare. Mrs. Hare and the children had retired for the night, and Mr. Hare was disrobing, when he heard a noise in the kitchen. Thinking some one was breaking in, he opened the door to the dining room and discovered a blaze. He closed the door and helped Mrs. Hare and the children to the home of Mr. and Mrs. Joseph Downs, across the street. In a few minutes neighbors were busy taking out the furniture, all of which was saved except from the dining room and kitchen. The department arrived in a short time, but the fire had gained such a headway that the structure could not be saved. Considerable damage was inflicted upon the contents saved, by water, but under the circumstances the owner feels very much gratified that the loss was kept down to the minimum. There was insurance on both house and contents, but the loss will still be several hundred dollars.

Had the fire occurred a little later, when the family was sound asleep, nothing would have been saved. A defective flue in the case assigned. The building caught fire several years ago, when W. V. Wiley was chief.

Nolan, who works for Emmott Bros., suffered an attack of suffocation, while working at the fire, and was revived by Dr. Tamesie.
