ROSELAIR BURIAL PAID

Will Make Endeavor to get Estate to Liquidate

The county board of commissioners, Judge Goodin presiding, met last week and finished op odd ends of claims and paid off some of the circuit court expenses. The claim for the burial of Mrs. Lizetta Roselair, who was murdered by her husband, was also paid. This was in the sum of \$180,50, and the county will make an endeavor to collect this out of the estate as soon as it goes to probate. The Roselair farm is worth perhaps \$3,000, and John Ritter, of Helvetia, has an unpaid mortgage, somewhere in the neighborhood of \$800; Jeffreys, who defended Roselair, has a claim of \$500, with interest; and the state has a claim against the property, filed in circuit court, of several hundred dollars. Jeffreys kad a deed to the farm, and he transferred it to a party, who in turn again transferred it so there may be some litigation over the thing, after all.
