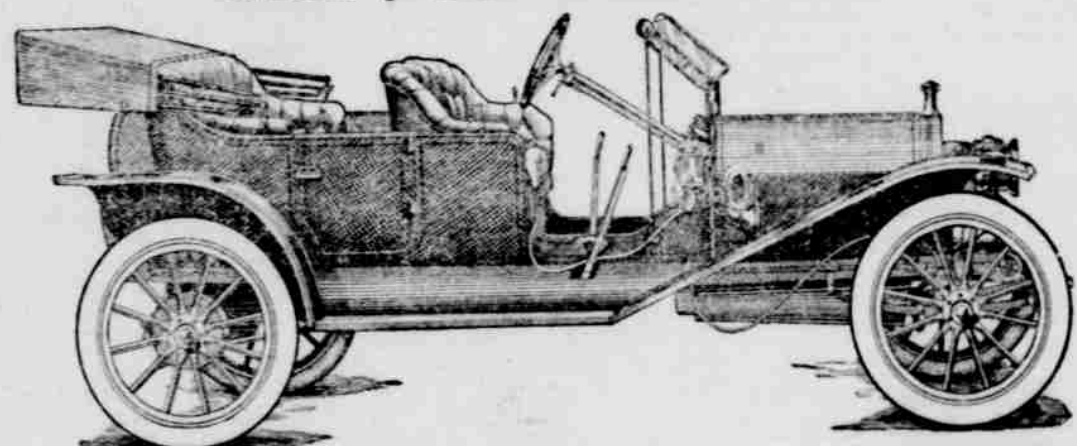

TROUT SEASON OPENS SATURDAY MORNING

Sportsmen are Getting Ready for
Excursions to Mountains

BE SURE AND GET A LICENSE

Must not Catch More Than Seventy-Five
in One Day

The State of Oregon dissolves partnership with the Oregon trout Saturday morning, and sportsmen are already mentally catching the limit of 75, which is the maximum number, under the statute, of one day's catch. You must have your license for exhibition when the game warden or his deputy comes around. You must not fish one hour before sunrise nor one hour after sunset, or you will be liable. Dynamite or powder come under prohibition, and while you can give away the speckled beauties you must not sell them. For minor violations, the fine runs from \$25 to \$150, while the powder stunt will cost you anywhere from \$200 to \$3,000.

Hook and line are all that Washington County Isaac Waltons can use.

Washington County is one of the best of the minor trout counties, and the upper Tualatin, upper Gales Creek, and the forks of Dairy are each year the scene of many fishing parties.
