BIG POWER COMPANY ASKS FOR FRANCHISE

MT. HOOD RAILWAY & POWER CO. Offers Two Per Cent Earnings

THEY ASK TO ENTER LIGHT FIELD

Present Ordinance, but Will Qualify and Re-Submit it

The Mount Hood Railway & Power Co. last evening presented a petition for a franchise to furnish electric light to patrons inside the limits of Hillsboro, and aver they are willing to pay the city two per cent on their gross earnings for the privilege of doing business for a term of 25 years. The ordinance was not introduced, as there are some features the company wishes to amend.

An ordinance was also passed requiring housemovers to deposit \$50 when the building passes over the Oregon Electric track, as a guaranty that expense of cutting and repairing wires shall be paid, and for the protection of the city.

The city fathers also passed a statute forbidding any woman to enter a saloon, and the penalty to the saloon keeper for allowing a female in his place of business is, minimum, \$25; maximum, \$50. It is provided, however, that a woman attaining her majority, in company with her husband or father, does not come under the ordinance. Election judges and clerks are to receive \$3 per day. City election takes place next Monday, on charter adoption or rejection, J. C. Lamkin, chairman; Peter Boscow and Ed. Schulmerich are judges, and Adolph Siegrist and Thos. Bailey are clerks.

The saloon ordinance takes effect next Saturday.

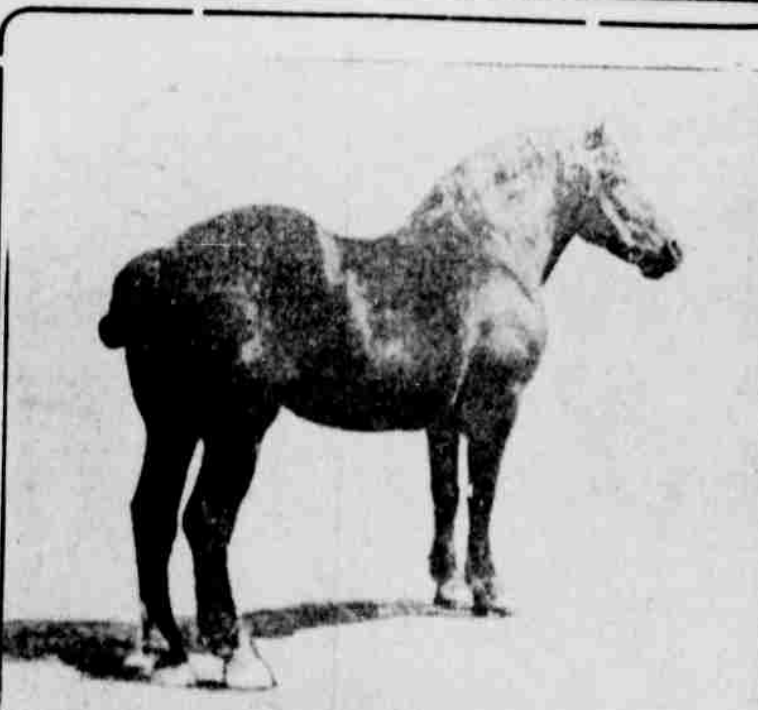

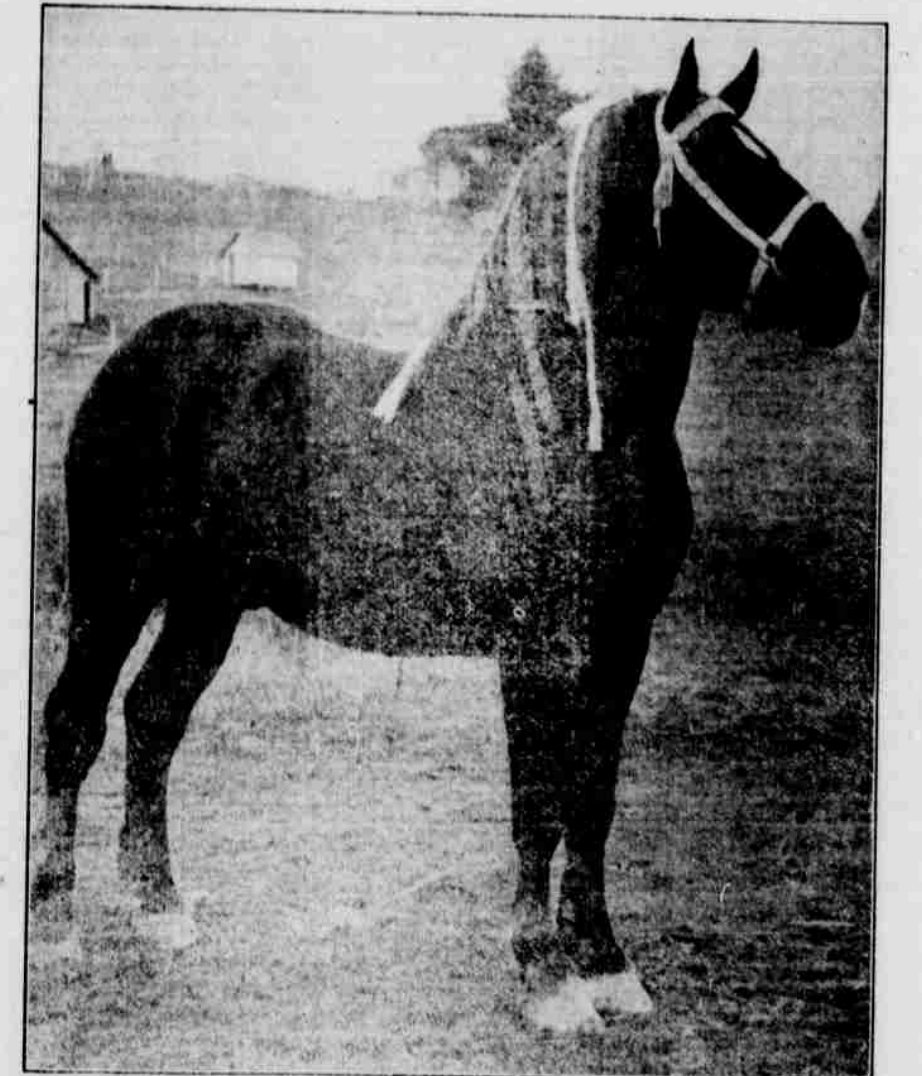
