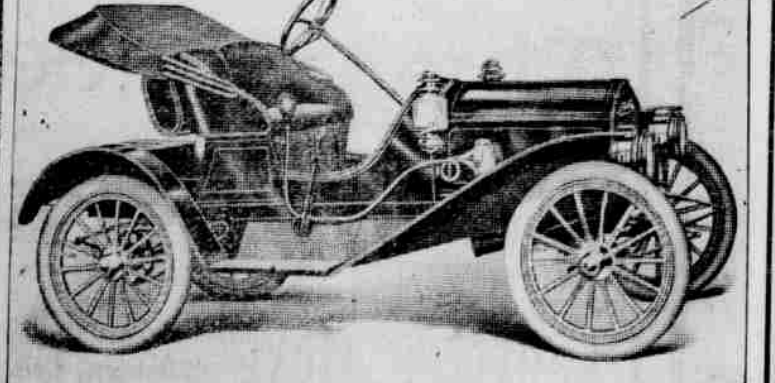

JOSEPH A. MOORE

Joseph A. Moore, of Hillsboro, died at the home of his son, J. A. Moore Jr., at Roy, Sunday evening, July 30, 1911, after an illness covering several months. He was born in Perry County, Mo., February 18, 1841, and early in life was wedded to Mary Kenney, at Perryville, Mo., moving to Oregon in 1881, settling near Garvais, Marion County. In 1882 he moved to Washington County, and settled near Forest Grove. His wife and the following children survive: Sister Pancretia, Sacred Heart Hospital, Spokane, Wash.; Sister Mary St. Carmel, Providence Academy, Walla Walla, Wash.; Hugh Moore, Verboort; Sister Moore, St. Josephs Academy, North Yakima, Wash.; Joseph Moore, of Roy; Pius L. Moore, Society of Jesus, Gonzaga College, Spokane, Wash.

Deceased was a member of Co. L, Fifth Missouri Cavalry, Civil War, receiving an honorable discharge at the close of his enlistment.

He was a member of the Catholic Church and interment was at Verboort, Rev. Father Daum, of Roy, officiating.

Mr. Moore was a man of integrity and had a host of friends, being noted for a breadth of generosity rarely found.
