Notice is hereby given that by virtue of an execution issued out of and under the seal of the circuit court of the State of Oregon for the County of Multnomah, dated the 5th day of September, 1911, in favor of Geo. B. MINNESOTA SHERIFF LIKES OLD OREGON

Arrived and Departed Tuesday. With Young Prisoner, Beecher
LIKE THE PEOPLE AND CLIMATE
Resides in Rochester, Made Celebrated by Mayo Bros., Surgeons

Sheriff William H. Mitchell, of Rochester, Minnesota, arrived in the city Tuesday, and started back the same evening with Reuben Beecher, the youngster brought down from Buxton by Constable McQuillan, to answer a charge back in the state of Senator Clapp. Young Beecher waived extradition, which eliminated a delay of several days.

Sheriff Mitchell said to an Argus reporter: "I like Oregon—the trip has been a revelation to me. I like the people I have met here; I like the looks of your soil, and the appearance of general prosperity. If I ever move from Minnesota I should certainly come to Oregon. Rochester? Where is Rochester? Well, sir, Rochester is a little country county seat, that has more people, transient, coming to it, as supplicants for medical and surgical aid, than any other town of its size in the world. It would remind you of the Mohammedans going to Mecca. Rochester is the home of the celebrated Mayo Brothers, physicians and surgeons, who have established a world-wide reputation by their surgery and appliances. People from the Orient; people from Europe; people from New Zealand—yes, people from Oregon, come to Rochester for surgical relief, and I have seen 2,000 transient people there after treatment at one time. Well, take care of yourself—I must catch that train, for may be there another warrant of arrest back there when I get home."

DEPUTY SUPT. SCHOOLS

Prof. C. W. Burt has been appointed Deputy County School Superintendent, and assumed the duties of his office last week. Prof. Burt has three years of Normal School training, has had a business college course, has taught eighteen consecutive years—the last twelve in high school work as Principal—and operates a typewriter rapidly and accurately.

Prof. Burt holds a life State Diploma in Oregon, and is in every way qualified for the work of the office. This arrangement gives Supt. Case more time for supervision, and with the help of James H. Jack, supervisor, the rural schools will receive attention and help equal to that of the city schools.

The county court has ordered a new bridge on the Oppenlander road north of Varley station, and the new structure will be 90 feet in length, and constructed of piling. There will also be 20 feet of fill.

Ed. Allen, of Allen & Wright, and a former Pendletonian, is nursing a deep grief because he did not have time to go up to the big Roundup but he says nothing short of a calamity will keep him away next year.
