### BIG DAMAGE SUIT

Paul J. Morette, the husband of May Morette, killed at Timber by a P. R. & N. train, has qualified as administrator of the dead woman's estate, setting forth in his petition that her effects are of the probable value of \$100. The petition sets forth that the woman was aged 38 years. Morette has retained attorneys and will sue the Pacific Railway & Navigation Co. for damages, the amount to be asked being as yet unknown. There will doubtless be two attorneys in the case, Hon. W. N. Barrett being the first retained.

The railroad company, it is understood, refuses to settle the case, and will fight the suit to the limit.

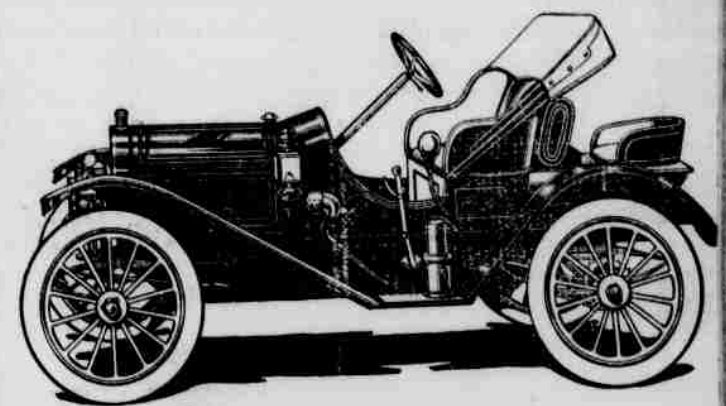
