## LENNEVILLE FINED SEVENTY-FIVE & COSTS

Forest Grove Blacksmith Pays  
Fine Into County Treasury

SHERWOOD HOLD-UP CONVICTED

Will be Sentenced by Judge Campbell,  
Friday Morning

Judge Campbell opened court Monday morning, and one of his first judicial actions was to fine Jos. Lenneville, the Forest Grove blacksmith, convicted of assaulting private Kurtz, of the U. S. Army, to pay a fine of \$75, and the costs of the trial, or to serve 37½ days in the county jail. Lenneville liquidated to the county treasury.

The only other case of importance on the criminal docket was State vs. Matto Marenovitch, charged with robbing John Poropot and three Slavonian companions, near Sherwood, last December, of a watch, ring, and some money. The complaining witness Poropot swore that he and one of his companions the next day shadowed Matto to town on the train, and had him arrested, and the watch and ring were found on his person. Matto went on the stand and swore that he bought the watch and ring from two men, and gave them three dollars and fifty cents. The jury, however, was out but fifteen minutes, when they returned a verdict of guilty as charged. Matto will be sentenced Friday morning. The jury: J. E. Bailey, foreman, H. Kanna, Leander Chowning, J. T. Young, C. Schamburg, Robt. McCracken, Milton Cole, F. Doughty, W. H. Heisler, W. H. Lyda, Clyde L. Leedy and J. T. Croen.
