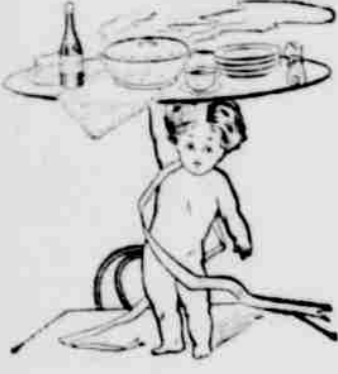

With this issue The Argus closes its seventeenth year in the Washington County field. Without boast it can safely say that no two newspapers in Washington County reach so large a clientele.

Beaverton had a city election, Tuesday, and the following officers will act the ensuing year: Mayor, W. E. Pegg; councilmen, H. W. Bolger and E. D. Boring; recorder, C. H. Fry; treasurer, J. L. Hardy; marshal, C. E. Hedge. A new charter was adopted by a small majority. There were two tickets up and the majorities were small.
