THIRTY-SIX THOUSAND FOR COUNTY SCHOOLS

Superintendent Case Makes the April School Apportionment

GETS \$4.75 FOR EACH OF SCHOOL AGE

Hillsboro Leads Next Highest by a Considerable Sum

Supt. M. C. Case last Friday apportioned to the various school districts of the county the sum of \$36,399.00, each district getting \$4.75 for each person of school age—between four and twenty. Hillsboro receives the greatest apportionment of any of the districts, with Forest Grove a close second. The money goes as follows:

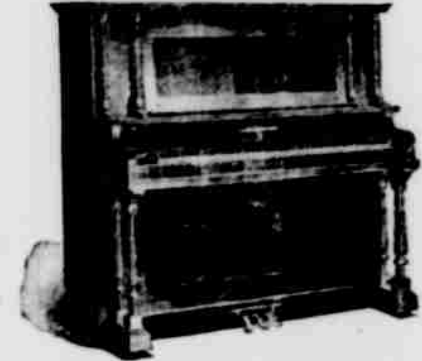
T. H. Howe and Mildred Daherty were married in this city, March 16, 1912. Rev. Willings officiating.

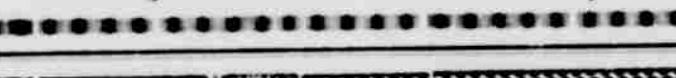

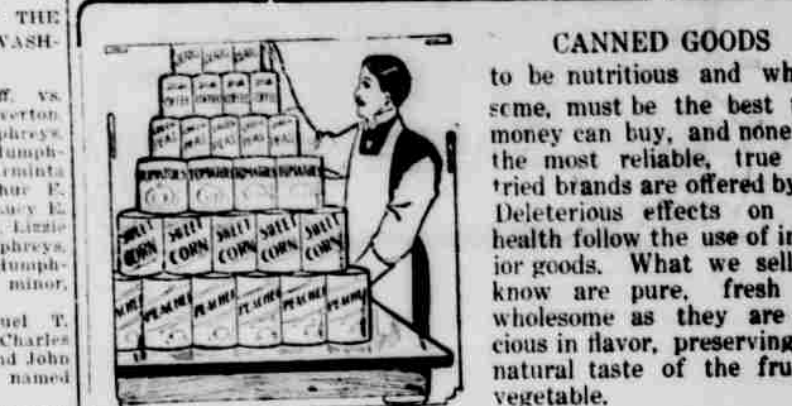
