COUNCIL PASSES CALL FOR BIDS ON WORK

Eleven Blocks of Rocklite, Three of Gravel Bitulithic
WEST END MAIN TO BE PLANKED
Pass Ordinance for Penalty for Exceeding Train Speed Limit

The city council had a session Monday evening, and notified the city recorder to call for bids on fifteen blocks of street paving. Eleven of these blocks will be paved with rocklite, and three will be paved with gravel bitulithic, while the block from First to the P. R. & N., on Main, will be planked.

The council also passed an ordinance requiring property owners to cut all tall grass along their property lines, and also to gather and burn all debris, and to keep the street lines free from old tin cans and other obstructions, unsightly.

The matter of the speed of electric cars was taken up before the council, Mr. Coolidge, of the Oregon Electric, having been in the city Monday, conferring with Mayor H. T. Bagley as to regulations of the proposed law. Twelve miles an hour was fixed as the speed limit, with alarms properly sounded, and violation of this schedule will mean from \$10 to \$50 fine for both conductor and motorman.

MRS. ELIZA MORISON ROSS

Mrs. Eliza Murray Morison Ross, widow of the late Rev. Geo. Ross, died at the family home north of Hillsboro, June 18, 1912, after an extended illness. She was the daughter of Rev. Joseph Morison, and was born at Mill-seat, Aberdeenshire, Scotland, April 17, 1830, and at death was aged 82 years and two months. She was married to Mr. Ross, of New Byth, Scotland, February 25, 1858, and came to Oregon in 1871. The husband died Jan. 11, 1894. He was a Presbyterian



minister, and widely known in Oregon.

Eight children were born to Mr. and Mrs. Ross: Joseph Morison Ross, Volmer, Idaho; Margaret Buckingham, Gifford, Idaho; George, deceased; William, residing on the home place; Helen, deceased; Mrs. Mary Schaefer, wife of J. B. Schaefer, postmaster, at Linnton, Ore.; and Robina Barron, Aberdeen, Scotland. She leaves 22 grandchildren and eight great-grandchildren.

Mrs. Ross was a member of the Presbyterian Church, and was universally esteemed and beloved by all who had the pleasure of her acquaintance. She was a woman of charitable impulses, and was always noted for helpfulness.

The funeral took place Thursday morning, June 20, and was attended by a large concourse of friends. Interment was in the Fuallatin Plains Presbyterian Cemetery.
