Best Game of the Season Played Sunday on the Local Grounds

The game at Athletic Park, Sunday, was absolutely the best baseball ever seen on a Hillsboro diamond, and it was one of the "league order" and big league, at that. Pitcher Scott, for Hillsboro, struck out nineteen men in the fourteen innings that resulted in a 1 to 1 draw game, and Pitcher Moreland, for the visitors, whiffed 13. Hillsboro's run was earned, while the visitors secured their tally by error. It was an exciting game, and the fans were in the air all the time. The Weonas were the only amateur team that had defeated Tillamook this year up to the time of playing in Hillsboro, and they have a fine aggregation. Hillsboro, however, showed great form, and the boys worked behind Pitcher Scott like veterans. Buck Freeman played great ball at second, and clouted out two two-baggers.
