

WHAT COUNTY SCHOOLS COST FOR THE YEAR

Each Person Of School Age Has Expenditure Of \$20.67

HILLSBORO DIST. LEADS NUMERICALLY

Grand Total of Expenditure Reaches Nearly 160,000

The county school superintendent's office has filed its annual financial report of Washington county schools, and shows that for each pupil of school age there has been an expenditure of \$20.67 for the year ending in June.

There were, last November, the grand total of 7,644 drawing school money, and the total disbursements for the year were \$158,914.72. The total receipts with the cash on hand at the beginning of the school year, were \$178,839.40. The report follows:
